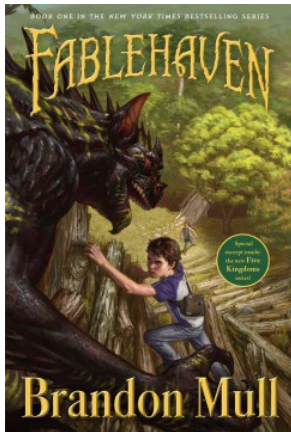

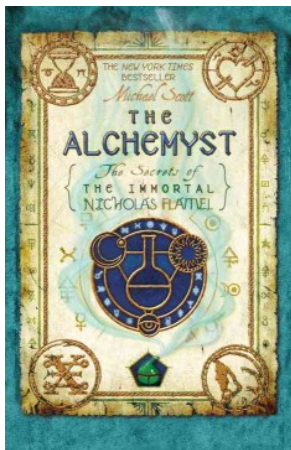
Miss Carrie says you have to clap your hands and sing along with some cold weather critters as they frolic in a freezy winter wonderland.

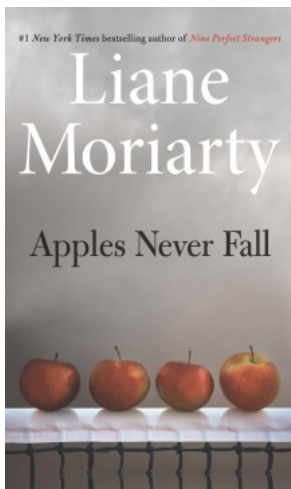


[The Alchemyst](#)

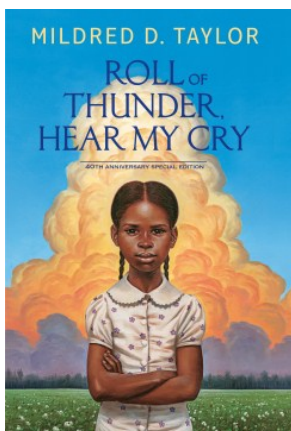


[Creative Cookie Decorating for Everyone: Buttercream Frosting Recipes, Designs, and Tips for Every Occasion](#)
