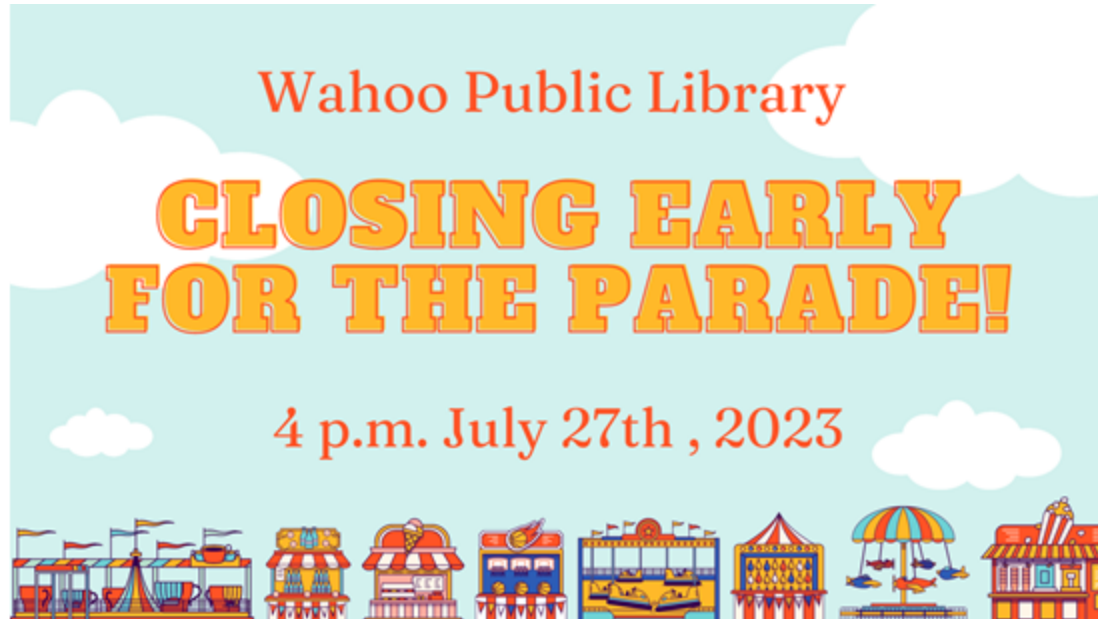

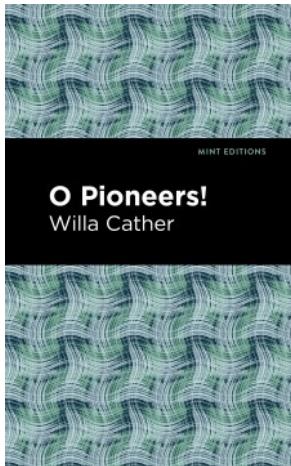

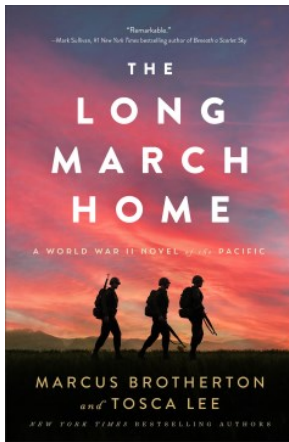


O Pioneers!

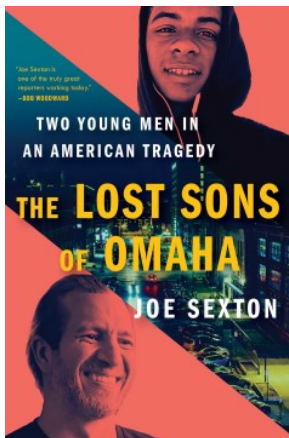


[The Long March Home: A World War II Novel of the Pacific](#)

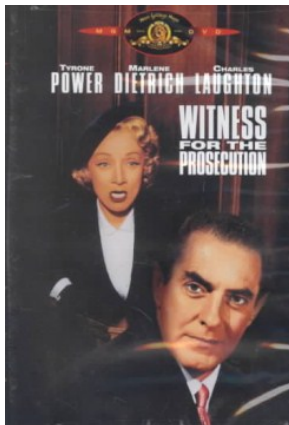


[The Lost Sons of Omaha: Two Young Men in an American Tragedy](#)

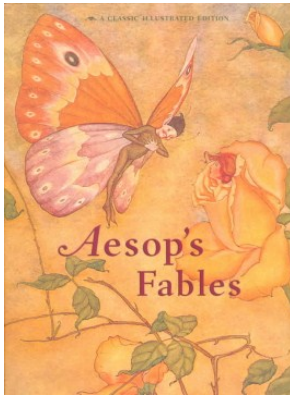


[Witness for the Prosecution](#)
