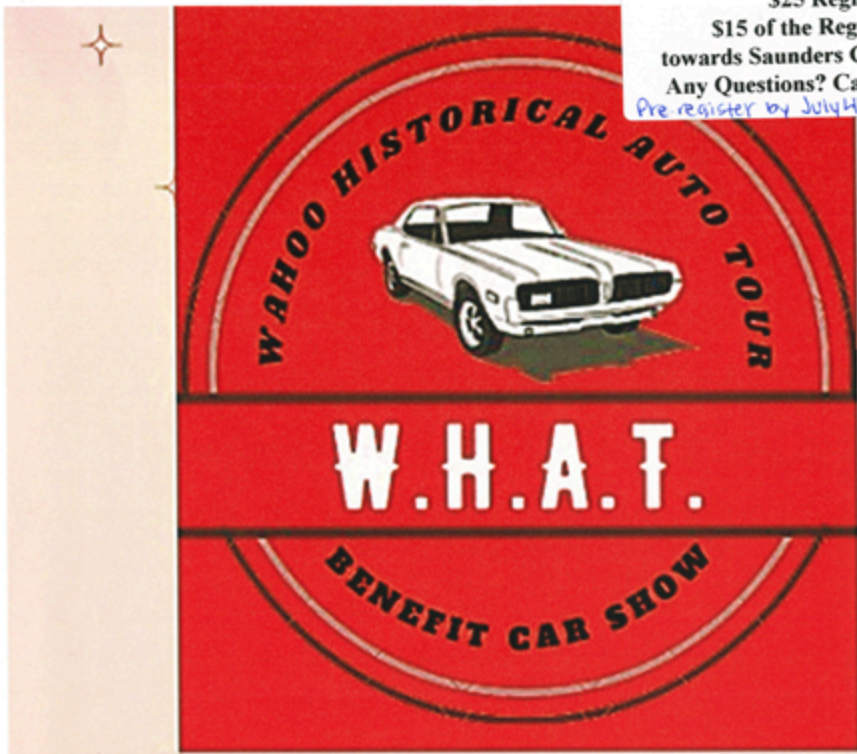
Wahoo Summer Pokémon Club

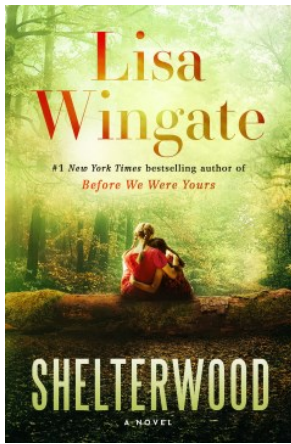

Shelterwood: A Novel

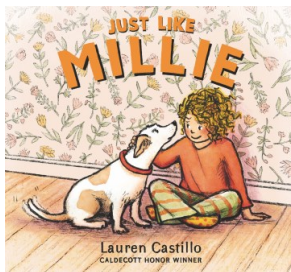
by Lisa Wingate

by Lauren Castillo

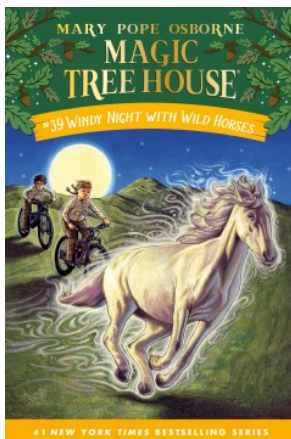

by Mary Pope Osborne

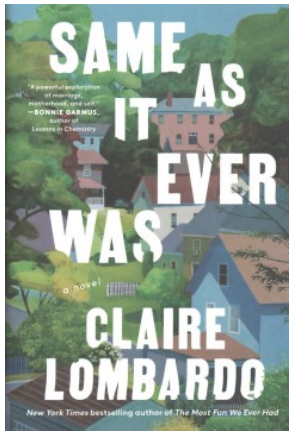

by Natasha Preston

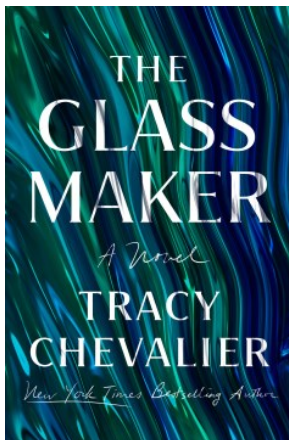
A visit to a private amusement park is the trip of a lifetime for a group of teen influencers, until they learn that getting off the island alive is not part of the plan. (*Teen*)

by Claire Lombardo

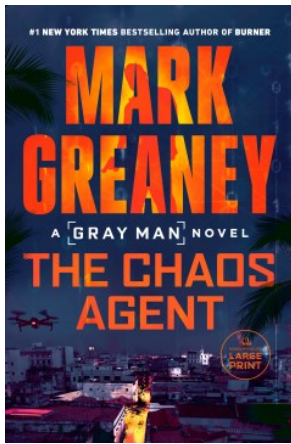

by Tracy Chevalier

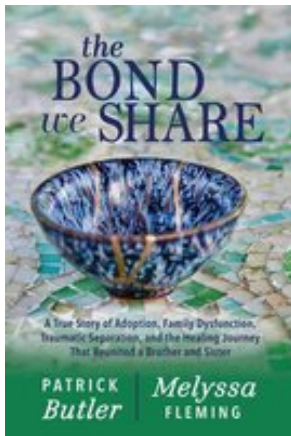

by Mark Greaney

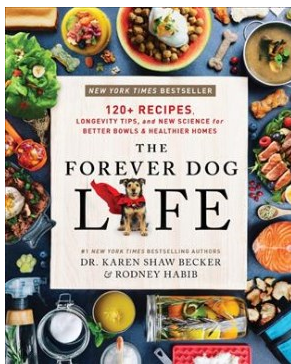

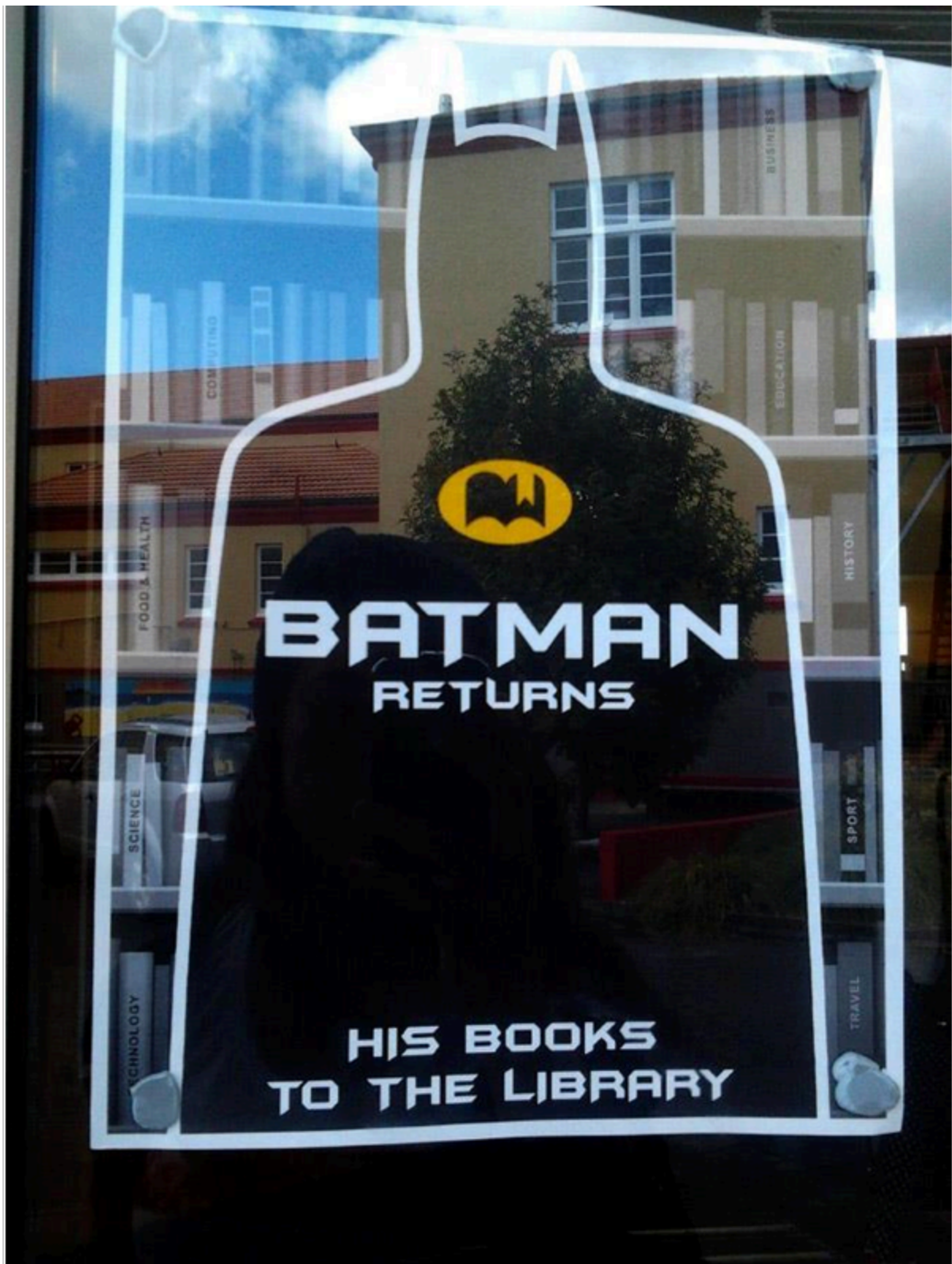
