Baby Brains

5 MONTHS

Baby may now grasp items and often immediately "tastes" everything, including books. Inexpensive washable vinyl or lightweight cloth books may be offered to baby for enjoyment.

According to Lovevery these following happen at 5 months:

Language & communication

- Start vocalizing emotions in new ways besides crying and laughing
- Start babbling longer strings of repeated sounds, like "baba-baba-baba"
- React to music by cooing
- Recognize their own name and react to it (between 5 and 7 months)

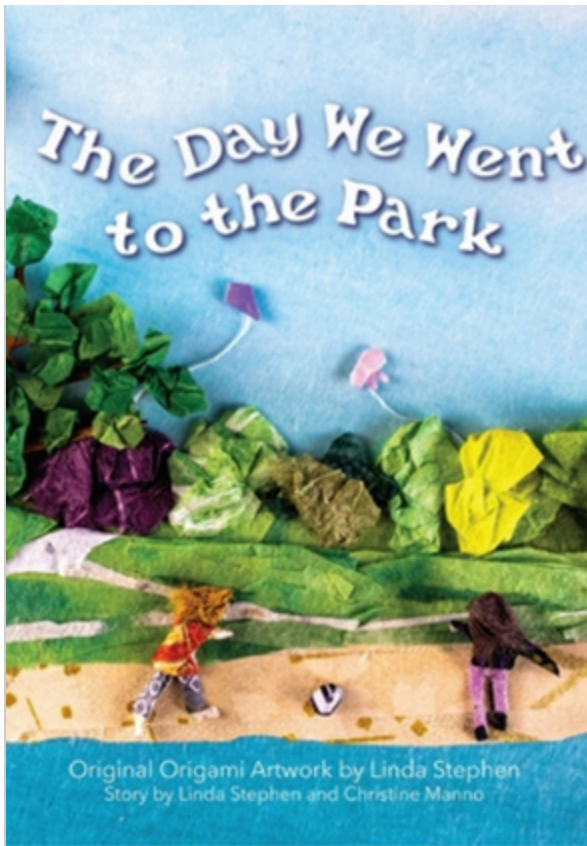

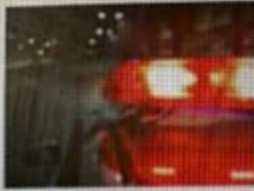

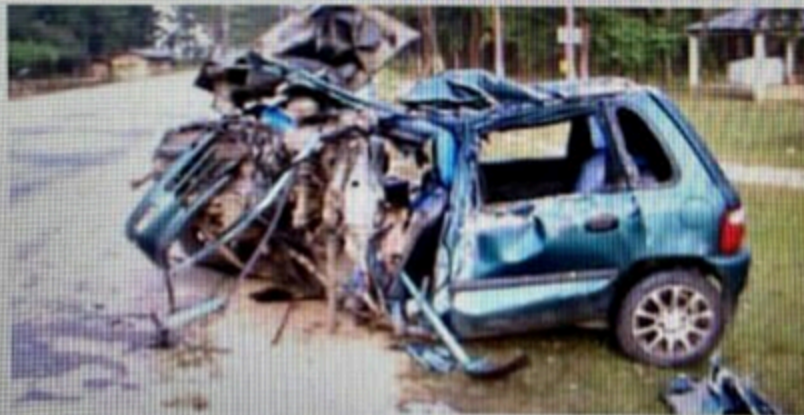
WHEN: JUNE 16TH, 2022, FROM 7:00PM TO 8:30PM

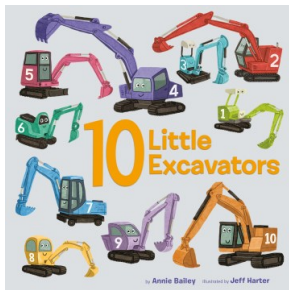

by Corey R. Tabor

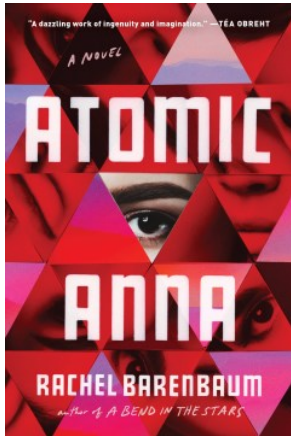

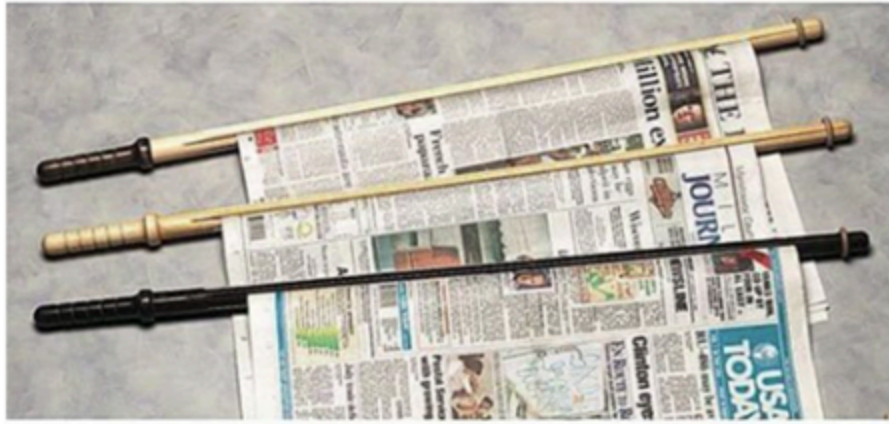
