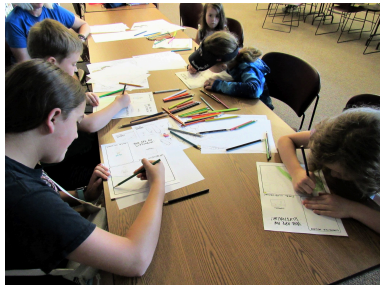


Chloe Burgett

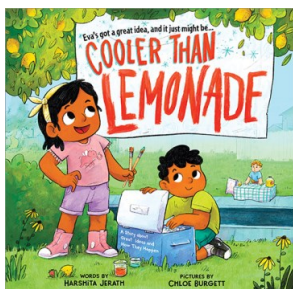

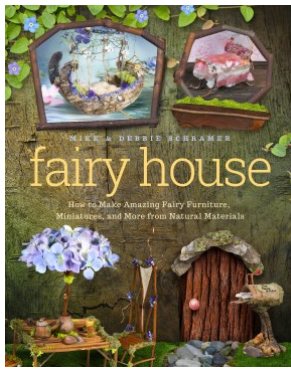
Cooler Than Lemonade

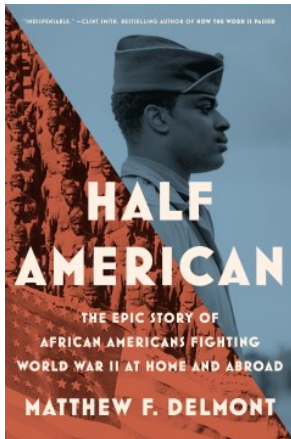


Fairy House: How to Make Amazing Fairy Furniture, Miniatures, and More from Natural Materials

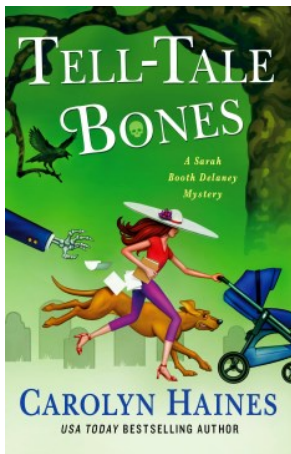
Spy x Family, Volume 1

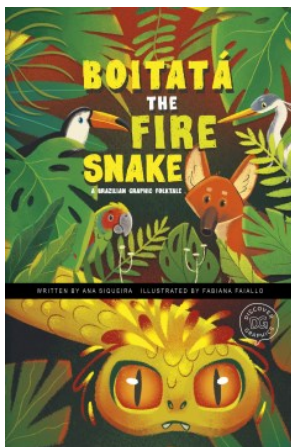

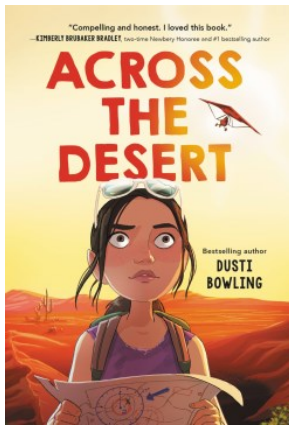

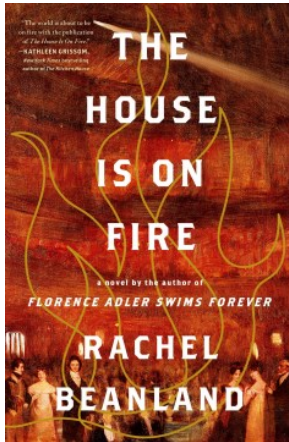
When the weather changes suddenly, the animals in a jungle find shelter in the mountains, but when they return to the forest, one snake has changed forever--and it is good thing he does.

by Dusti Bowling

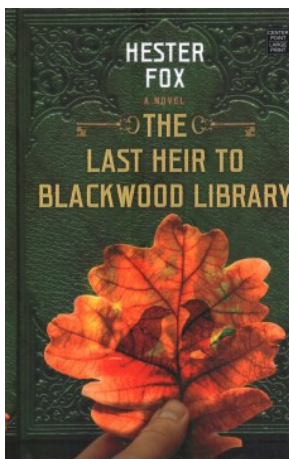

by Rachel Beanland

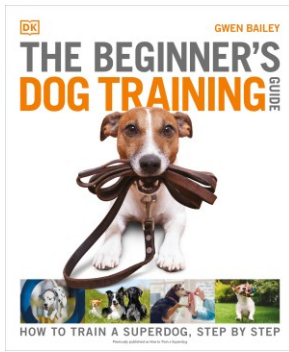
