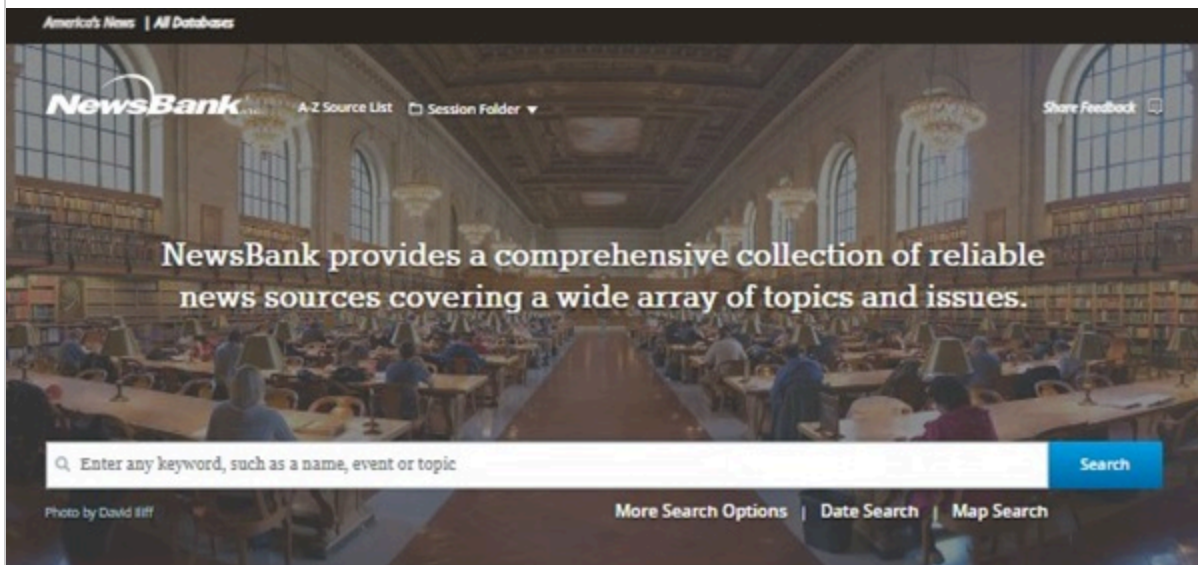

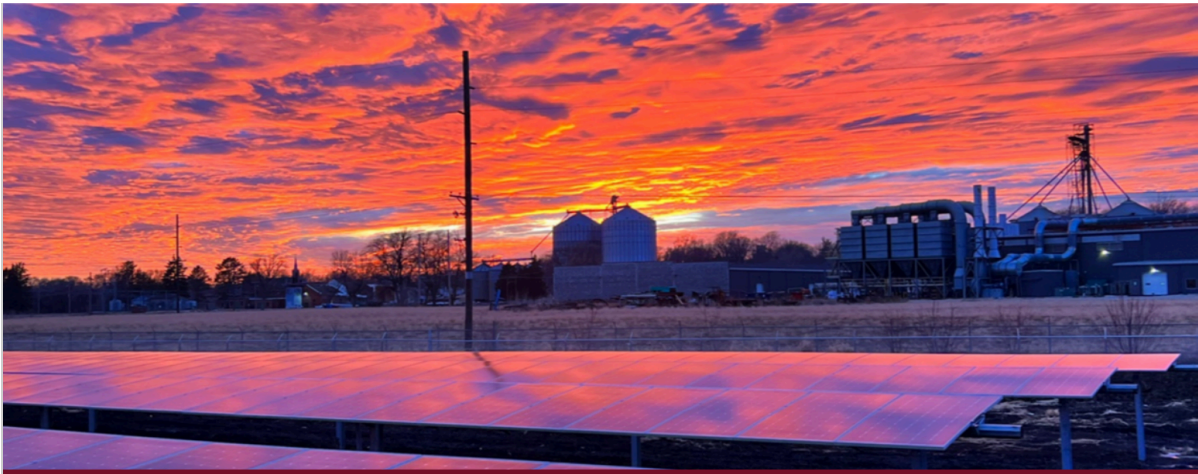

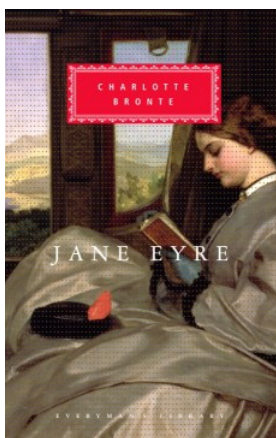


High Tea and Misdemeanors

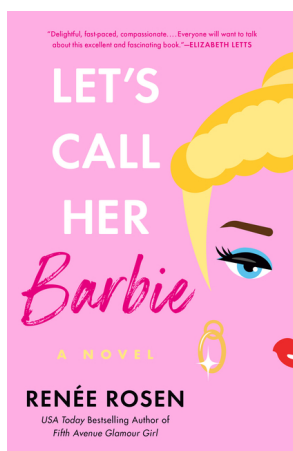
Jane Eyre

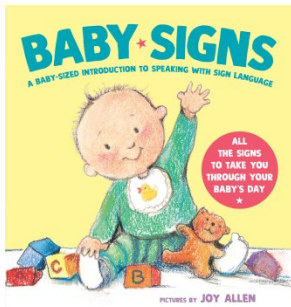

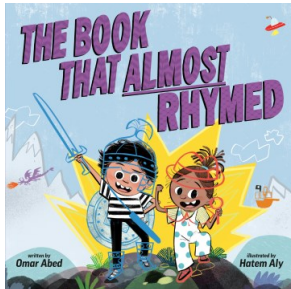

by Joy Allen

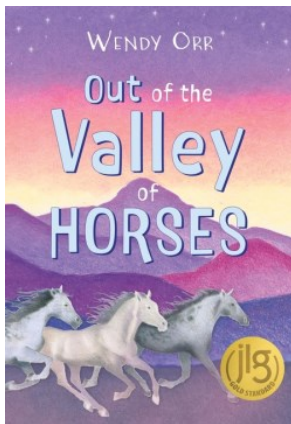

by Omar Abed

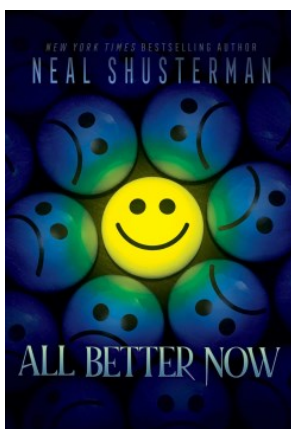

by Wendy Orr

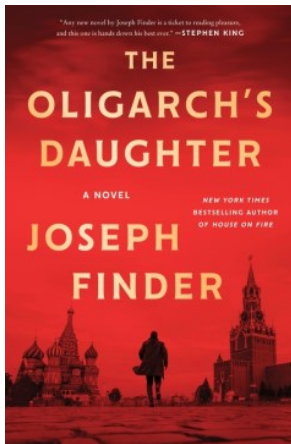

by Joseph Finder

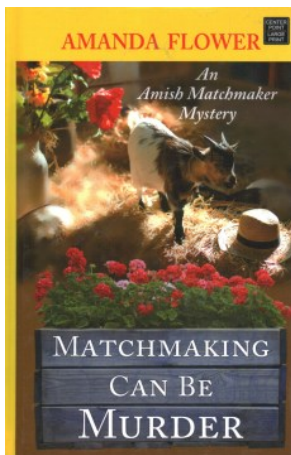

by Charmaine Wilkerson

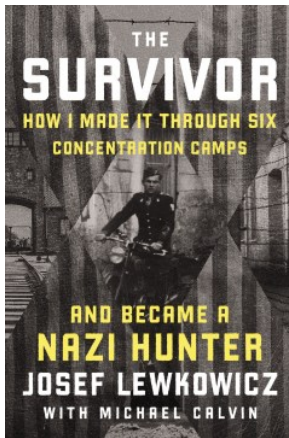

by Amanda Flower

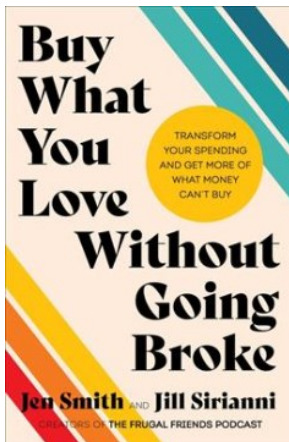
