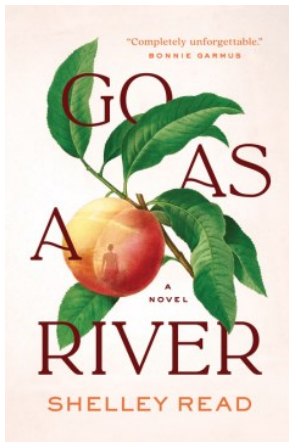


Dracula

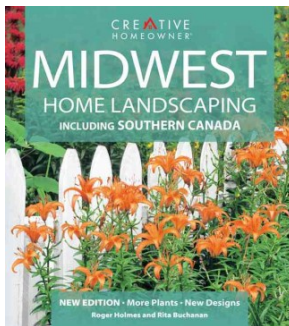


Go as a River

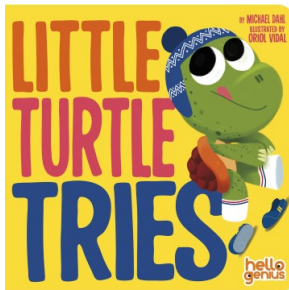
Midwest Home Landscaping: Including Southern Canada

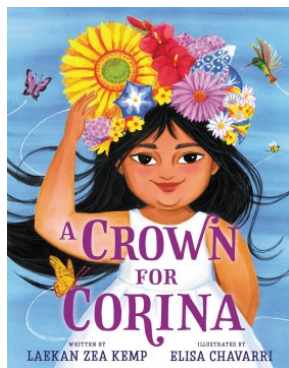

by Michael Dahl

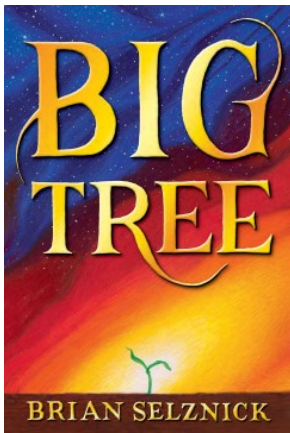
It is time to get dressed, which is no easy task for Little Turtle, but he is determined not to give up.

by Laekan Zea Kemp

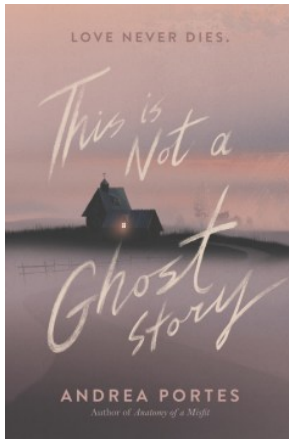

by Brian Selznick

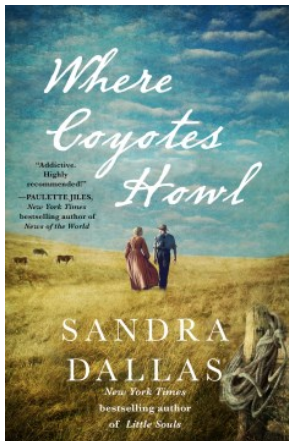

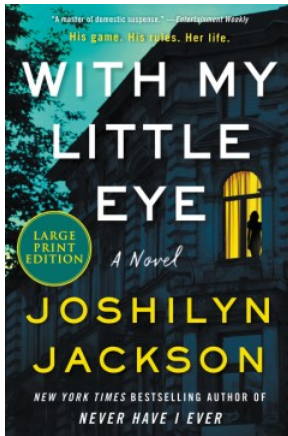

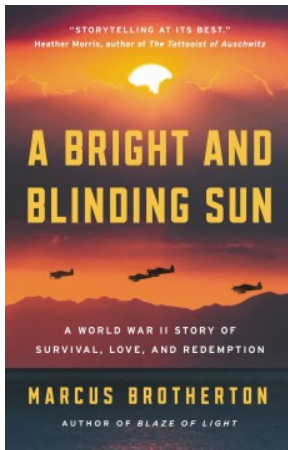
