Baby Brains

9 MONTHS

Keeping special books in baby's bag will insure that a quiet activity is handy when you are waiting the doctor's office, at church, in the car, and so on.

"By 9 months, your baby is much more mobile and likes to explore. Babies at this age are crawling and can raise themselves to stand, so safety in the home becomes an important issue as your baby's curiosity (and mobility) grows. Your baby now responds to her/his name, loves to cuddle with family members and may show shyness or fear of strangers. 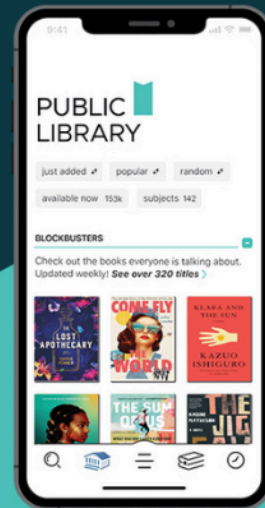

If you want to save your OverDrive history, you will need to export it before you switch to libby. Instructions are below.



Getting started with Libby

Libby is made possible by your local library and built with by OverDrive.

The Libby app is the easiest way to get started with digital books, audiobooks, and magazines from your public library!

- 1 Install Libby for Android, iOS, or Fire tablets from overdrive.com/apps/libby. Or, visit libbyapp.com in your Chrome, Firefox, Safari, or Edge browser.
- 2 In Libby, follow the prompts to find your library and sign in with a valid library card.
- 3 Browse your library's collection and borrow a title.
- 4 Borrowed titles appear on your Shelf () and download to the app automatically when you're on Wi-Fi, so you can read them when you're offline. On your Shelf, tap **loans** at the top of the screen. From there, you can:
 - Tap **Read With...** to choose whether you'd like to open a book in Kindle (U.S. libraries only) or Libby.
 - Tap **Open in Libby**, **Open Magazine**, or **Open Audiobook** to start reading or listening in the app.
 - Tap **Manage Loan** to see options like **Renew Loan** and **Return Early**.

Getting Kindle Books from Libby

Libby is made possible by your local library and built with by OverDrive.

With Libby, you can send most books to a Kindle or Kindle reading app.

- 1 Install Libby for Android, iOS, or Fire tablets from overdrive.com/apps/libby. Or, visit libbyapp.com in your Chrome, Firefox, Safari, or Edge browser.
- 2 In Libby, follow the prompts to find your library and sign in with a valid library card.
- 3 Borrow a book from your library's collection. To only see books that can be sent to Kindle, tap **Preferences** (in a list or in search results), then change **Supports to Kindle** and tap **Apply Preferences**.
- 4 Borrowed titles appear on your Shelf (). From there, tap **Open Book**, then tap **Kindle**. You'll be taken to Amazon's website to finish getting the book.
 - If you're signed into your Amazon account, verify the "Deliver to:" device and tap **Get Library Book**.
 - If you're not signed into your Amazon account, tap **Get Library Book**, sign in, and choose a device to deliver the book to.

Now you're ready to start reading on your Kindle. Happy reading!

Using Libby on a Fire tablet

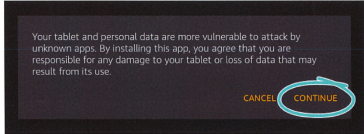
Amazon Fire users can install Libby using our APK (Android Package file), since Amazon has not yet added the Libby app to the Amazon Appstore.

Note: The Libby APK is supported on Fire tablets with Fire OS 5+.

1 On your Fire tablet, open the Silk browser and visit this download link: <https://www.overdrive.com/apps/libby/kindlefireapk>.

2 You may get warnings saying that the Silk browser needs more access on your device or that this kind of file should be avoided. We test our file to make sure it's safe, so you can safely dismiss these messages for our Libby APK.

Tap **OK**, **Allow**, or **Continue** to proceed. (The wording of the warnings may vary.)



3 Once the file downloads, tap **Open**. (If you're unable to open the file from this prompt, locate the file in your downloads folder and tap to open.)



How to export your history from your library's digital collection or the OverDrive app

Exporting your full OverDrive borrowing history

You can export a CSV file of your [Borrowing History](#) for your records. Your history includes your borrowed titles and any titles you added manually.

To export your history:

- Go to [Library](#).
- Select **Actions** > **Email history**.
- Enter your email address, then select **Submit**.

Exporting your OverDrive app download history

You can save a list of titles you've downloaded to OverDrive's app for Fire tablets, Android, Chromebooks, or iOS (iPhone/iPad/iPod touch). You can keep the list for your records, but you won't be able to restore it if it's ever lost or deleted.

Fire tablets, Android, and Chromebook

- In the OverDrive app, select the icon in the top-left corner to open the **Home** menu.
- Click or tap **History**.
- Select **Show all**, or choose individual titles, then select **Share**.

4 If you get a message saying your device is not allowed to install unknown apps from this source, tap **Settings** and toggle "Allow from this source" on.



Note: We recommend turning this setting off after installing the Libby app. This will prevent you from accidentally downloading unsafe files in the future.

5 Tap the **back** button in the top-left corner, then tap **Install**.



6 Once the app is finished installing, tap **Open** to start using Libby.

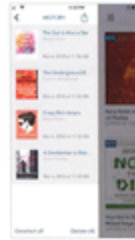

4. You can then email your title history to yourself (or others), or choose another export option, if available. If your device doesn't show any titles under "History," you can enable the feature in "Settings" for future use. Use the **Show in History** and **remember bookmarks** for... drop-down menu to select how many titles you'd like the app to remember.

iOS (iPhone/iPad/iPod touch)

- In the OverDrive app, tap the icon in the top-left corner to open the **Home** menu.
- Tap **History**.
- Tap **Show all**, or choose individual titles, then tap the **Share** icon.



4. You can then email your title history to yourself (or others).

Using Libby with an ereader

You can download Libby ebooks on a computer, then use free Adobe Digital Editions (ADE) software to transfer them to Adobe-compatible ereaders.

Note: If you have a Kindle or Kobo ereader, ask a library staff member for the guide for those devices.

1

On a computer, visit libbyapp.com. Follow the prompts to find your library and add your library card.

2

Borrow an ebook that supports EPUB or PDF format.

Tip: Check which formats an ebook supports by clicking the book cover and scrolling down to the "Supports" section of the title details page.

3

Go to your **Shelf** (📖), then select **Read With...** next to an ebook.

*Note: If you have a reading preference set, select **Manage Loan**, then **Read With...***

4

Select **Other Options**, then EPUB or PDF. This will download a file that can be opened in Adobe Digital Editions (ADE).

5

Open the downloaded file in Adobe Digital Editions (ADE), connect and authorize your ereader, then drag the ebook from ADE onto your device.

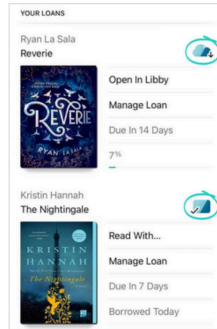
What titles are downloaded for offline use?

In the Libby mobile app, with the default settings, all loans are downloaded for offline use when you have a Wi-Fi connection.

In libbyapp.com, you always need an internet connection to browse, borrow, and read or listen to your loans.

You can find all of your loans on your **Shelf** (📖). From there, you can see what's downloaded for offline use:

- A loan with a card-and-checkmark icon (📖) is downloaded on your device for offline use.
- A loan with a cloud icon (☁️ or ☁️) isn't downloaded on your device. It'll be streamed when you open it, requires an internet connection to read or listen to, and doesn't take up space on your device.

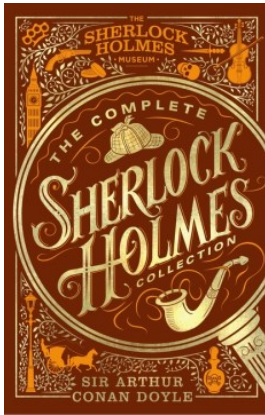

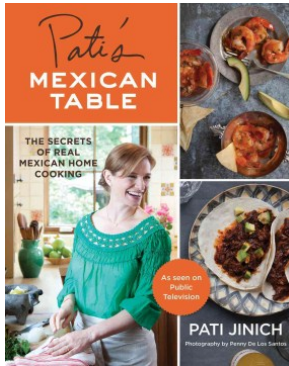


The Complete Sherlock Holmes

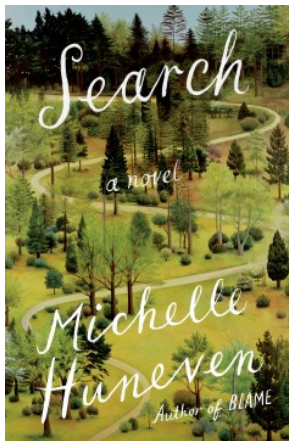


Pati's Mexican Table: The Secrets of Real Mexican Home Cooking

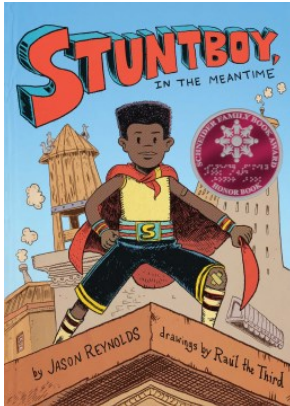
Little ones can learn their ABCs while going through their nightly routine, in this engaging yet calming board book that makes getting ready to catch some ZZZs an enjoyable experience.

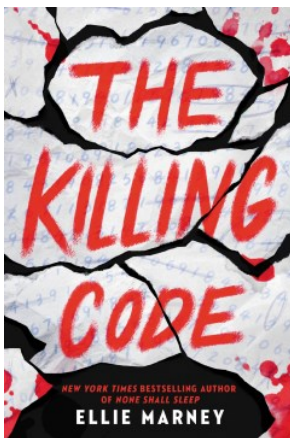

by Jason Reynolds

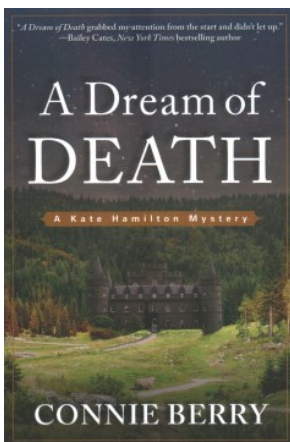

by Ellie Marney

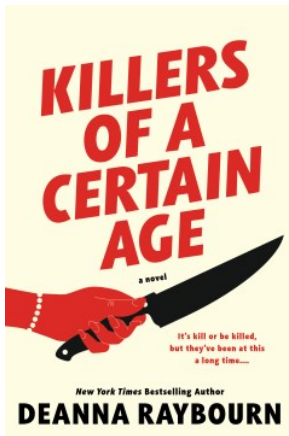

by Connie Berry

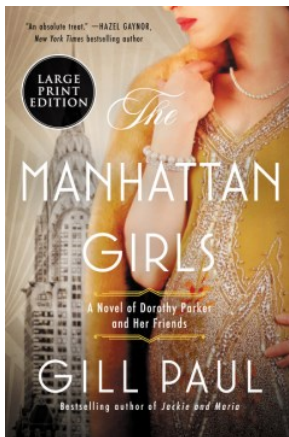

by Tom Scalisi

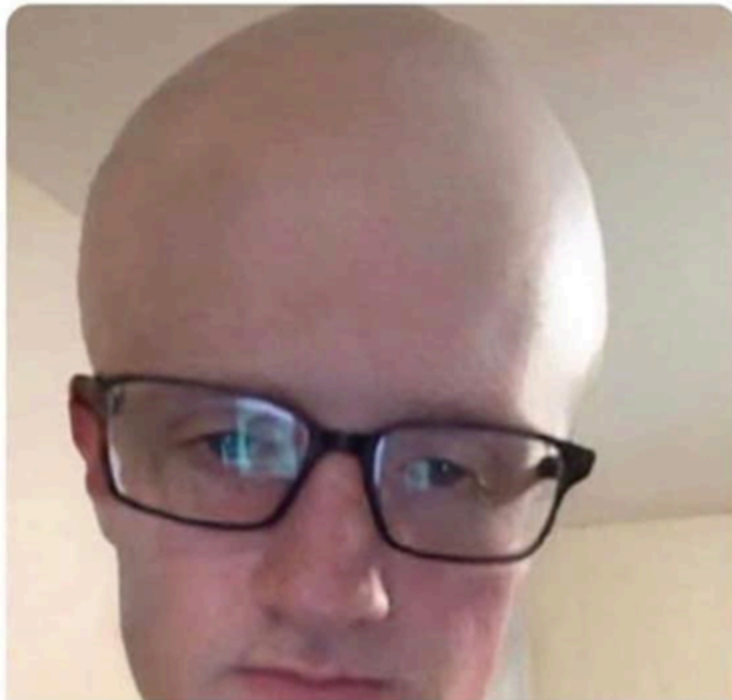
