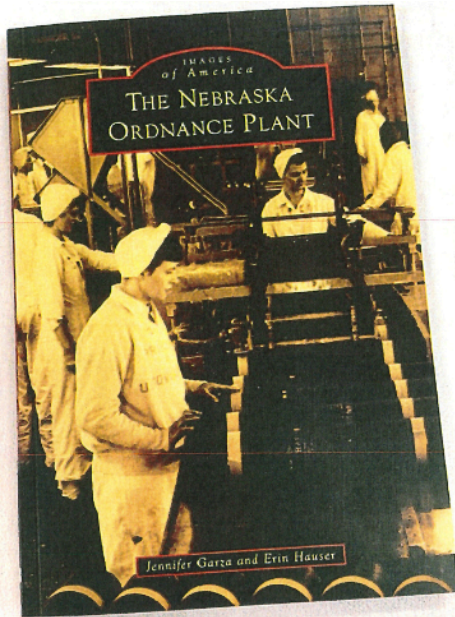

## **OUT OF CITY LIMIT CARD FEE TO BE RAISED**

**Beginning in the new fiscal year (October 1), the Wahoo Public Library will be increasing the library card fee for non residents of Wahoo. Library card fees have not been raised since 2006. The new costs will be:**

**Out of city limits: \$25  
Out of county: \$30  
Additional family cards: \$2 a card**

**All card holders have free access to digital services which include Libby, hoopla, and Newsbank.**

### *The Container Garden Recipe Book: 57 Designs for Pots, Window Boxes, Hanging Baskets, and More*

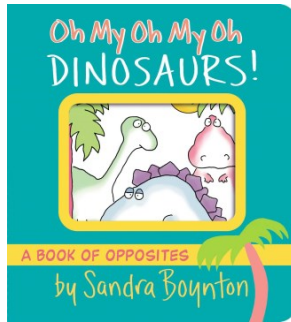

There are recipes specifically designed to boost your home's curb appeal (a rustic birdcage-turned-hanging basket, a stately Japanese maple planted in a painted terra-cotta urn) and others that are perfect for backyard entertaining (an elegant tabletop trough of succulents, a concrete water garden that's sure to be a conversation starter). And with Lana as their guide, readers' yards will never be bare thanks to the creative designs for all seasons, from urns bursting with spring bulbs to an heirloom pumpkin converted into the perfect home for fall blooms. And recreating these stunning designs couldn't be simpler. Each recipe includes a detailed ingredients list and step-by-step

instructions, along with hundreds of photos showing where and how to place each plant. Also included is foundational information on choosing vessels, planting techniques, and care instructions, as well as plant spotlights highlighting foolproof options for all climates and seasons, from spring bulbs to evergreens. *(Non-Fiction)*

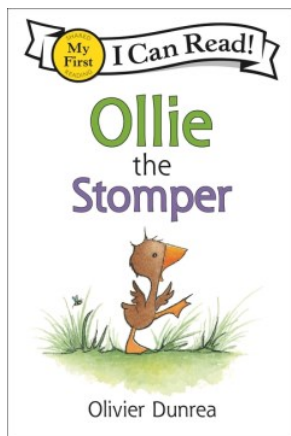
## New Books

by Olivier Dunrea

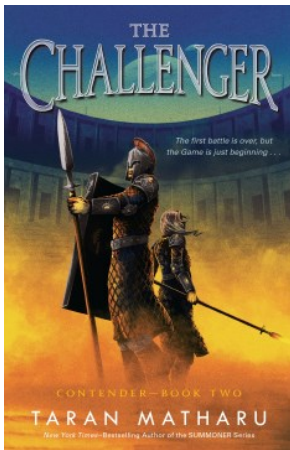

by Christopher Lincoln

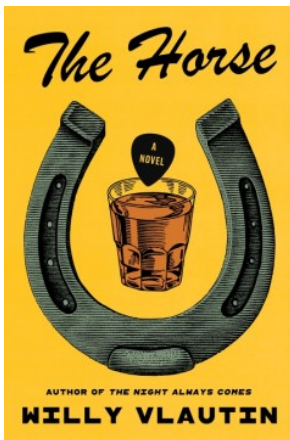

by Taran Matharu

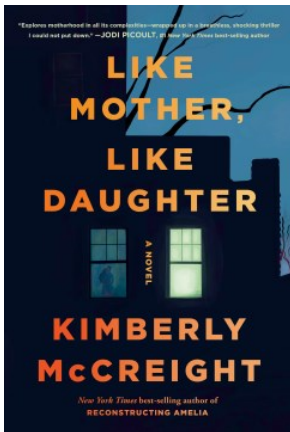

by Willy Vlautin

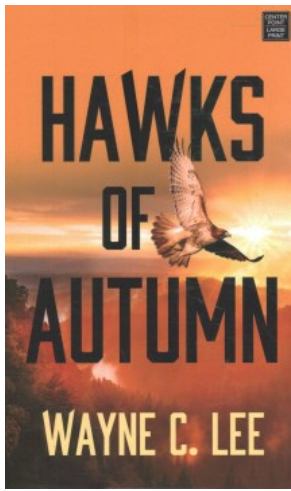

by Kimberly McCreight

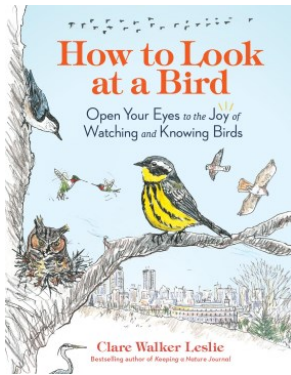

by Wayne C. Lee

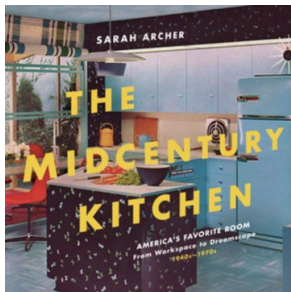
