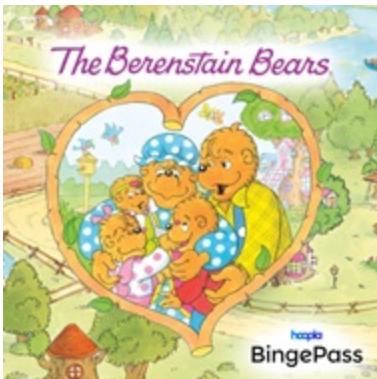


Puzzmo

by Gordon Korman

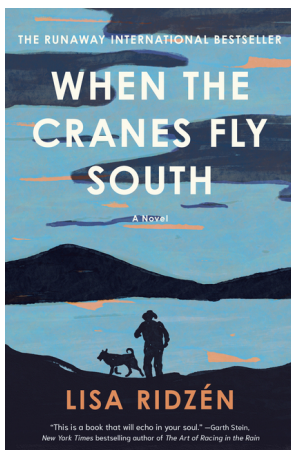

by Betty C. Tang

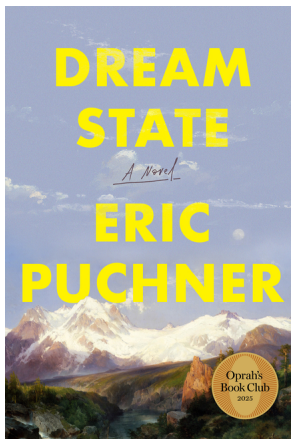

by Lisa Ridzén

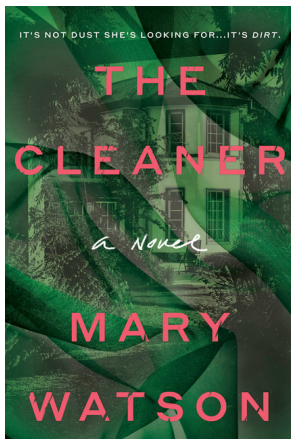

by Eric Puchner

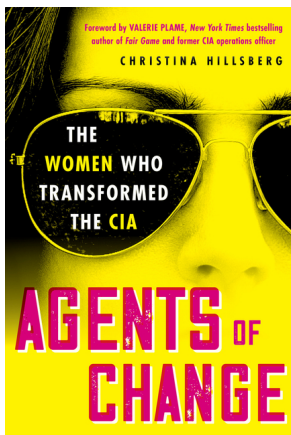

by Mary Watson

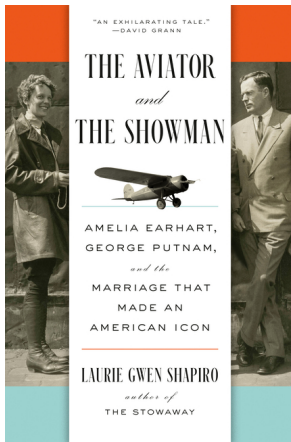
